Celebrating Birthdays

Introduction: Celebrating birthdays can be done in simple ways or elaborate and involved ways. We'll talk about this today.

- 1. Are birthdays celebrated in your home culture? If so, is there a special song that is sung at a birthday celebration?
- 2. Are there milestones in a baby's first year of life that are celebrated in your home culture? (100-days after birth, etc.) Please explain.
- 3. Are there any other "milestone" birthdays in your home culture? (age 16, age 40, etc.)
- 4. Is it common to have a "themed" birthday party for a child in your culture? For example, a child may have a princess-themed birthday party where all of the decorations are related to a princess. Have you ever been to a "themed" birthday party? Please explain.
- 5. Cake and ice cream are typical desserts served for a birthday party in the U.S. Are there special foods that are shared for a birthday in your home country? Please explain.
- 6. Sometimes middle school-aged kids (11-14) may have a "sleep-over" birthday party. Is this common in your home culture? Please explain.
- 7. Who would attend a child's birthday party in your home culture? Who would attend a teenager's birthday party? Who would attend an adult's birthday party?
- 8. Surprise birthday parties are also a way that people celebrate a birthday. A family member plans a party and the person whose birthday it is does not know about this party until the guests arrive for the party. Does this happen in your home culture? Please explain.
- 9. In your home culture, do teachers in schools allow children to bring a treat for the other children in the class to help celebrate their birthdays if the birthday is on a school day? Please explain.
- 10. Are gifts given for birthdays in your home culture? Please explain.
