

English Conversation: Students practice speaking English in a casual setting in a group of 3 – 6 people. Worksheets are provided on topics related to life today.



ESL Bible Class (offered at various times)

This ancient book has inspired much language in American culture. English Bibles are provided free-of-charge for participants. No Bible knowledge necessary.

<u>Idioms and Slang</u> The American language uses many idioms and much slang. This class will help define idioms and slang expressions that are common in every-day life in America today.

<u>Pronunciation</u> Students receive instruction and practice in pronouncing words that are difficult for them. (Class is not currently meeting.)
